

ESDCTA Statement of Purpose

Eastern States Dressage and Combined Training Association (ESDCTA) was founded in June 1969 and incorporated in 1970 as a nonprofit educational organization under the laws of the State of New Jersey. ESDCTA with membership open to all interested in dressage and combined training, has the following stated purpose: "Whereas it is the desire among many equestrians in the United States to foster and stimulate interest in dressage and eventing in the hope that this may ultimately benefit the United States Olympic Team in its international competition, this organization is established as a nonprofit educational organization." Its further purposes are to foster and stimulate interest in dressage and eventing in general, to educate, conduct clinics and hold dressage shows and combined training events.

THE START BOX

Eventing News

If you are considering going to your first horse trial, good for you! Here are a few suggestions from an eventer and mom of an eventer. I strongly suggest first trying out a combined test or dressage and clear round jumping show. This will help get you used to a dressage test followed by jumping without the challenge of cross country. You may also want to attend some horse trials just to watch, or better yet, volunteer (you won't be turned down).

Remember to give some thought to conditioning both you and your horse. Cross-country at the lower levels doesn't require a lot of conditioning but it really depends on the horse.

When you feel you are ready, try a starter event. It has a little less pressure than a USEA recognized event to give you the chance to see how it all works. Be sure to know the rules, though. Most starter events follow the USEA rules and it is worth taking the time to read through the most recent rule book so there are no surprises. If you plan to go to a USEA recognized event, consider becoming a member. It is financially better than paying a non-member fee for Beginner Novice if you plan to do more than one event during the season.

Next, an equipment check is needed. Dressage requires an SEI approved helmet that is dark colored like black, dark blue, or dark brown. Cross country requires a medical arm band, jumping vest (safety), and an SEI approved helmet. Stadium jumping also requires an SEI helmet and medical arm band, but jump vests are optional.

An important tip is to have a plan for the day before and the day of the trial. Get as much done as you can the day before: braid, prep the trailer and hay nets, and pack everything you can. www.useventing.com has a wonderful check-list under "forms and documents". If possible walk the cross-country course the day before, but if not, leave time to walk the course twice. When you plan the day, take everything into account. For example, know your departure time, arrive and tack up time, and warm-up based on dressage time. Know when you will walk the cross-country course, when you'll eat (yes, this too), and when you'll walk the stadium jumping course based on your ride times. It really helps if you don't have to rush. Be prepared before you ride. Take off all the pressure possible so you can enjoy it!

Hopefully, these tips will be of use. Good Luck!

Judge Shadowing The Latest Installment in the Youth Education Award Program

The ESDCTA Youth Committee is proud to announce our latest installment in the Youth Education Award Program - Judge Shadowing. ESDCTA youth members will now have the opportunity to shadow a judge at an ESDCTA-registered schooling show for a day or a half-day and earn credit towards the Youth Education Awards. We all know the benefits of scribing for a judge for a day, but Judge Shadowing takes this benefit one step further. The participant will sit in the judge's booth along with the judge and scribe, but they will have the ability to watch all of the rides and hear all of the scores and comments without having to worrying about scribing and keeping up. Since the participant doesn't need to do anything but watch and listen, they can truly experience what it is like to be a judge and learn exactly what a judge is looking for as they watch a test.

Many of the judges in our area have already expressed a desire to be a part of this great new program, as have several of the show managers registered with ESDCTA. A list of judges and show managers who are willing to participate in this program will be posted on the ESDCTA website, or youth members can contact Jill Kuc at <code>esea@ptd.net</code> to obtain the latest list. If any judges and/or show managers would like to participate but have not yet registered with Jill, we encourage them to do so as soon as possible so that we can give our youth members as many opportunities as we can to participate in this great program.

It will be the responsibility of the youth member to contact both the show manager and the judge to receive their approval for judge shadowing and to determine if it will be for a whole day (4 credits) or a half-day (2 credits). The youth member must then bring the Participation Form (available on the ESDCTA website) with them to the show to have the judge sign certifying that they completed the judge shadowing.

This is an amazing opportunity in so many ways. Youth members will learn what it takes to be a dressage judge, what the judge is looking for in different movements and at different levels, and how much the judge is really rooting for the competitor. Dressage judges truly want to help the horse and rider to reach their full potential and it will be great for our youth members to see that firsthand. Any questions pertaining to Judge Shadowing or the Youth Education Award Program in general can be directed to any of the Youth Committee Co-Chairs.

Youth Dressage and Eventing Team Competitions and Deadlines:

The deadline to apply for either of the Youth Dressage Team Competitions for 2012 is May 15. The two competitions are: Lendon's Youth Dressage Festival, being held on July 6-8 at Hits on the Hudson, and the Region One Youth Team Competition, being held on July 28-29 at Morven Park.

The deadline to apply for the Youth Eventing Team Competition at the Stuart Horse Trials is also May 15. The competition will take place July 12-15 in Victor, NY.

The deadline to apply for the Youth Eventing Team Competition at Burgundy Hollow is September 15. This competition will take place on October 28.



Ever wonder why the state animal of New Jersey is the horse? Well, now you know...

In 1977 Governor Byrne signed into law the official decree for the horse to be the state animal of New Jersey. Michael McCarthy and his fifth grade classmates at Our Lady of Victories School in Harrington Park, plus James Sweetman, an eighth grader from Freehold NJ, were integral in making it happen. It is because of their efforts that the horse is now the State Animal of New Jersey. One reason the horse was promoted was that the US Equestrian Team is headquartered here. Governor Byrne also said the following:

"The founding fathers of our state thought so highly of the horse that they included it in our state seal. Today there are 4,654 horse farms in New Jersey, of which 888 raise racing horses. The Horse industry makes a contribution to the preservation of green acres at a time when great demands are being made for the preservation of our land."

Horses are also part of the official symbols of 10 other states. In Vermont and Massachusetts it is the Morgan, in Alabama it's the Racking Horse, Idaho has the Appaloosa, in Kentucky and Maryland it's the Thoroughbred, Tennessee has the Tennessee Walking Horse, North Dakota the Nokota horse, and Missouri uses the Fox Trotter.




